

Thinking of Engaging an External Online Facilitator?

As you consider engaging an external facilitator for one of your online meetings, the following list may help you focus on how you want that person to contribute. [NOTE: These are example and do not include all possibilities!]

Design Input

- Greater internal stakeholder participation in planning the workshop.*
- Earlier input from workshop attendees.*
- More involvement in setting the agenda and flow.*
- Greater involvement of key management members and/or Board members*
- Broader input from key external stakeholders prior to the meeting.*
- Deeper sense of context for planning session.*

Meeting Execution (using appropriate techniques and online tools)

- More engagement of all participants.*
- More energized participants at the end of online meetings.*
- Bigger picture thinking.*
- Greater sense of camaraderie.*
- Broader exploration of critical issues facing the organization.*
- More relaxed online working environment.*
- Wider variety of conversation formats (small group, plenary, etc.)*
- Inclusion of *more* external presenters via technology.*
- More physical activity integrated into the meeting.*
- Decrease in undue influence of CEO/Board Chair.*
- Better process for surfacing and resolving internal conflicts.*
- Better use of humour to allow for tough conversations to happen more readily.*
- Greater flexibility to adjust agenda/flow to follow greater value that may emerge in the meeting.*

Potential Focus for Meeting Content

- Stronger linkages of strategies to tactics to be built into operational plans.*
- More time provided to explore future oriented scenarios.*
- Deeper understanding of the competition and their key advantages.*
- Broader appreciation for how international politics and economics impact local markets.*
- More in-depth exploration of succession issues, challenges and priorities.*
- Expanded possibilities for growing new business lines.*
- More useful assessment of organizational strengths, weaknesses, threats and opportunities to be addressed strategically.*
